RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS  
COUNTY OF SANTA BARBARA, STATE OF CALIFORNIA

IN THE MATTER OF ADOPTING THE ) RESOLUTION NO. 95-138  
GOLETA TRANSPORTATION )  
IMPROVEMENT PLAN INCLUDING THE )  
GOLETA BIKEWAYS ELEMENT )

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WITH REFERENCE TO THE FOLLOWING:

- A. In 1987, The Board of Supervisors appointed the Goleta General Plan Advisory Committee to assist the County in updating the Comprehensive Plan's goals, policies and land use designations as they pertain to Goleta.
- B. From 1987 to 1993, Community workshops and many public meetings were held to determine appropriate goals, policies, development standards, and land use designations for the Goleta Planning Area.
- C. In August 1993, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Barbara certified 91-EIR-13 with an addendum which identified the combined effect of congestion at sixteen critical intersection in Goleta, a potential funding shortfall of \$11 million for needed capital improvements, lack of adequate rights-of-way to widen roads and intersections, and the undesirability of adversely effecting Goleta's quality of life as being a significant and unavoidable impact resulting from ten-year buildout of the Community Plan.
- D. In August 1993, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Barbara approved the Goleta Community Plan which requires the development of an integrated capital improvement plan for the planning and implementation of future roadway, bikeway and transit improvements which prioritizes critical improvements and increased levels of funding for alternative transportation in order to reduce congestion on Goleta roadways and intersections.
- E. It is now deemed in the interest of the orderly development of the County and important to the preservation of the health, safety, and general welfare of the residents of said County that the Board of Supervisors adopt the Goleta Transportation Improvement Plan (Attached as Exhibit 1).
- F. Public officials and agencies, civic organizations, and citizens have been consulted on and have advised the Planning Commission on the said proposed amendments in a duly noticed public hearing pursuant to Section 65353 of the Government
