

1 RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE
2 COUNTY OF SANTA BARBARA, STATE OF CALIFORNIA

7 WITH REFERENCE TO THE FOLLOWING:

8 A. On August 17, 1965, by Resolution No. 24908, this
9 Board of Supervisors adopted a General Plan for the entire county,
10 which included a General Plan Report, a book containing 155 pages
11 of text and designated as Exhibit GP-10.

12 B. In 1970, the Legislature of the State of California
13 added a Conservation Element to the list of the mandatory elements
14 required in all general plans, as provided in Gov't.C. § 65302(d).

15 C. A Conservation Element is defined in Gov't.C. § 65302(d)
16 as follows:

17 "A conservation element for the conservation, develop-
18 ment, and utilization of natural resources including
19 water and its hydraulic force, forests, soils, rivers and
20 other waters, harbors, fisheries, wildlife, minerals, and
21 other natural resources. That portion of the conservation
22 element including waters shall be developed in coordination
23 with any countywide water agency and with all district and
24 city agencies which have developed, served, controlled
25 or conserved water for any purpose for the county or city
26 for which the plan is prepared. The conservation element
27 may also cover:

28 (1) The reclamation of land and waters.

29 (2) Flood control.

30 (3) Prevention and control of the pollution of
31 streams and other waters.

32 (4) Regulation of the use of land in stream channels

1 "and other areas required for the accomplishment of the
2 conservation plan.

3 (5) Prevention, control and correction of the erosion
4 of soils, beaches, and shores.

5 (6) Protection of watersheds.

6 (7) The location, quantity and quality of the rock,
7 sand and gravel resources.

8 D. It is now deemed in the interest of the orderly develop-
9 ment of the County and important to the preservation of the health,
10 safety, and general welfare of the residents of the County to
11 adopt a Conservation Element consisting of 302 pages of text and
12 additional maps interspered between the pages of text.

13 E. The Planning Commission of the County of Santa Barbara,
14 after holding a duly noticed public hearing on the said Conservation
15 Element as required by Section 65351 of the Gov't.C., approved,
16 endorsed, and transmitted to this Board said recommended element
17 by its Resolution No. 79-11.

18 F. This Board has held a duly noticed public hearing on
19 the above-described element, as required by Section 65355 of the
20 Government Code.

21 NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED as follows:

22 1. The above recitations are true and correct.

23 2. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 65357 of the
24 Gov't.C., the above-described text and additional interspered maps
25 entitled "Conservation Element" is adopted as an element of the
26 Santa Barbara County General Plan.


27 3. Pursuant to the provisions of Gov't.C. § 65359, the
28 Chairman and Clerk of this Board are hereby authorized and directed
29 to endorse said element to show that said element has been adopted
30 by this Board.

31 4. Pursuant to the provisions of Gov't.C. § 65360, the
32 Clerk of this Board is hereby authorized and directed to send


1 endorsed copies of said element to the planning agency of each city
2 within this County.
