On March 5, 1979, by Resolution No. 79-134, the Board 11 of Supervisors of the County of Santa Barbara adopted the 12 Santa Barbara County Comprehensive Plan Noise Element. 13 It is now deemed in the interest of the orderly develop-14 В. ment of the County and important to the preservation of the 15 health, safety and general welfare of the residents of the County 16 to adopt the following additional provisions to Policy No. 4 (at 17 18 page 59): The units were constructed prior to 5 March 1979, 19 20 the original adoption date of the Comprehensive Plan Noise Element; 21 22 b) The measures necessary to reduce the noise exposure 23 in exterior living areas below 65 dB $\rm L_{DN}$ would be technically infeasible, prohibitively expensive, 24 and/or aesthetically undesirable; 25 Noise levels in interior living areas will not 26

exceed 45 dB L_{DN}:

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d) Any prospective buyer of a converted unit shall be notified, prior to entering any sale contract, if any private or common exterior living areas associated with the unit for sale are exposed to noise levels of 65 dB $L_{\rm DN}$ or greater. The specific details of this notice shall be established in a condition of approval of the tentative parcel or tract map for the condominium conversion;

- e) Any converted units and associated common areas subject to airport noise exposures of 65+ dB $L_{\rm DN}$ shall be subject to an avigation noise easement acceptable to the airport operator;
- f) The State Department of Real Estate's Public Report for the converted units shall disclose that the units are within a 65+ dB $L_{\rm DN}$ (or CNEL) noise area, shall identify the primary source(s) of noise affecting the units, and shall refer to any avigation noise easement required by subparagraph 'e' of this Policy.
- C. The Planning Commission of the County of Santa Barbara, after holding duly noticed public hearings on the above described item, has considered and transmitted to this Board its recommendations by Resolution No. 84-6.
- D. This Board has held the duly noticed public hearing on the above-described item as required by Gov't Code § 65355.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The above recitations are true and correct.
- 2. Pursuant to the provision of Gov't Code § 65357, the

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above-described additional provisions in the Noise Element of the Comprehensive (General) Plan of the County of Santa Barbara are adopted as an amendment to the above-mentioned noise element, subject to the conditions described herein.

- 3. Pursuant to the provisions of Gov't Code § 65359, the Chairman and the Clerk of this Board are hereby authorized and directed to endorse said amendments to the Noise Element to show that such amendment has been adopted by this Board.
- Pursuant to the provisions of Gov't Code § 65360, the Clerk of this Board is hereby authorized and directed to send endorsed copies of said amendment to the planning agency of each city within this County.
